Dan Henderson, N1ND, has been the Regulatory Information Manager of the American Radio Relay League (ARRL), the national association for Amateur Radio since June 2006. In that capacity, Dan wears a myriad of hats. He handles regulatory information queries from members, works on antenna regulation and zoning issues, interfaces with the FCC for rules interpretation and enforcement issues, serves as a resource to the ARRL Field Organization on state and local legislative issues, handles member inquiries on reciprocal operating, and manages the League's Volunteer Counsel and Volunteer Consulting Engineer programs. He also serves as the liaison to the Legislative Action program, edits the ARRL's Legislative Update newsletter, and works with the ARRL's Washington team. He also works with other departments on a wide array of issues including handling the ARRL's work on the PAVE PAWS radar interference problem.

Before accepting the challenging job running the Regulatory Information office, Henderson was the Contest Branch Manager, running the ARRL's contest program for almost eight years. Additionally, Dan serves as Assistant Secretary to the corporation and assists the work of the ARRL Board of Directors, Executive Committee, Programs and Services Committee, and the Ethics and Elections Committee.

A native of Asheville, NC, Dan was first licensed in 1970 as WN4YMV and later held the call signs WN4QQN, WD4HCY and WA4QQN. His interests in Amateur Radio include DXing, contesting, public service communications, Elmering and education. He has operated off-shore from C6, G, F, HB9, 4U1ITU, I, DL, VE, and twice from HV0A. He holds DXCCs on Mixed, CW and Phone and has a couple of ARRL Contest awards to his credit.

Prior to working at ARRL Headquarters, Henderson was a Political Science Instructor at several colleges and universities, and earlier, a high school teacher and coach. He is an alum of the University of Notre Dame, Appalachian State University, the University of Vermont and the University of Georgia. However, his callsign phonetics - Number One Notre Dame - shows where his loyalty resides.
